Participants learn where they stand in comparison to strong project leaders in key areas such as communication, empathy, emotional intelligence, and more.

The way we work has changed for the foreseeable future, adding layers of complexity to the existing project delivery model. WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Review how personality and emotional intelligence affects leaders' behavior and day-to-day tasks.
